Many people lined up outside electronics stores in Tokyo to pick up the *Nintendo Switch 2*, 8 was released around the world on June 5. The Switch 2 has a larger and higher resolution^{*1} screen than that of the Switch 1, with ^(a)improved processing power, offering smoother and more beautiful graphics. Its *GameChat*^{*2} allows players to communicate with friends and family 9 playing a game, and lets them share their game screen with others. Players can also talk with other players using the microphone inside the device. Nintendo expects to sell 15 million Switch 2 game machines during the business year that ends in March 2026.

The company has promised to release attractive software for the Switch 2 later this year, including *The Legend of Zelda* games, a *Pokemon* title and a *Kirby* game, as well as offerings from outside software companies. 10, Nintendo is taking advantage of the release by opening a store in San Francisco and a Super Nintendo World amusement park in Orlando, Florida, both planned for this month.

In the US, the Switch 2's price is \$449.99 —significantly higher than the original Switch's price of \$299. US orders before release for the Switch 2 were ^(b)delayed for several weeks so the company could see how new taxes^{*3} might affect them.

Ⅳ 火星 (Mars) について書かれた次の文章を読み、各設問に答えよ。

For a long time, people thought there was life on Mars. In 1877, an Italian astronomer^{*1}, Giovanni Schiaparelli, thought he saw some straight lines on Mars. He did not know what they were, but an American astronomer, Percival Lowell, saw them too, and decided that they were canals^{*2}. There must be people on Mars, Lowell thought, and these Martians^{*3} have built the canals to bring water from the icy Arctic^{*4} in the north of Mars to the warmer south.

When the first spacecraft^{*5} flew past Mars in the 1960s, they sent back photographs of a dry place, covered with craters^{*6} – as dead as our Moon. There were no Martians, no straight lines. But then, in 1971, the spacecraft Mariner 9 went much closer to Mars, and found something surprising. There were no

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 on Mars, but there were old rivers! There was no water in them now, but once, millions of years ago, they had been full of water.

So where has the water gone? And is there any there now? These are very important questions, because if there is water on Mars, then perhaps there is life there too. Photos taken on the surface of Mars show that there was water there once – lots of it. Scientists think a lot of the water floated away through the thin atmosphere into space. But they hope that some of it is still there, frozen into the rocks under the ground. If that is true, then there may already be very small life forms – bacteria^{*7} – living in the rocks.

In January 2004 two Mars rovers^{*8}, Spirit and Opportunity, landed on Mars. The rovers and the other spacecraft have discovered lots of interesting things about Mars. Like the Earth, Mars has an atmosphere^{*9} – but the atmosphere on Mars is very different from ours. The Earth's atmosphere is 21 per cent oxygen^{*10} and just 0.035 per cent carbon dioxide^{*11}. But the atmosphere on Mars is 95 per cent carbon dioxide. So if an astronaut^{*12} ever lands on Mars, they will need to wear a space suit.

Because the atmosphere on Mars is so thin, the Sun only heats up the air for a few centimetres above the surface. Above that, it is quite cold. So the

temperature at our astronaut's feet will be perhaps 21 °C, while the temperature on the top of their head is 0 °C. It will be 22!

There are often strong winds on Mars. They sometimes blow at hundreds of kilometres an hour, making huge dust storms which cover the planet. Because the dust rises high into the atmosphere, the sky above Mars is not blue, as it is above the Earth, but red.

One day soon, people will try to travel to Mars. 23. The astronauts will have to live together in a small spacecraft for nearly a year. Then, when they land, they will not be able to walk outside without space suits. With the terrible sandstorms and icy cold temperature, it will be a bit like living on Antarctica^{*13}, but worse: on Mars there are storms of red sand instead of snow, and there is no oxygen for humans to breathe^{*14}.
